PPA2360 GUIDELINES FOR PLANNING Semester 2, 2024

For each successive Professional Experience, the Pre-service teacher should keep Learning Experience Plans available in a dedicated Professional Experience File.

Anecdotal notes, reflections and feedback through discussions with the Mentor Teacher will all inform the planning of future learning experiences.

The Professional Experience File should indicate a professional attitude as well as evidence of thoughtful and thorough organisation and preparation.

The best of these learning experiences could be used as evidence of professional development to include in a Professional Portfolio.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE FILE and DOCUMENTATION Documentation should be available at all times for reviewing by Mentor Teachers. University Supervisors and School Practice Coordinators. Professional Experience Files should demonstrate a high level of organisation and a high standard of presentation of all documents. Documents should be word-processed, where possible, or written neatly and legibly. **Clearances** Working with Children Check (WWCC) • Nationally Coordinated Criminal History Check - Department of Education (NCCHC) **Cover Page** • Pre-service Teacher's name • Course Title eg.
